

SONG STRUCTURE: FOLSOM PRISON BLUES

Folsom Prison Blues is a country style song even though the title would make you think it was a blues song. There are 24 bars for each section which are in strophic form so once you learn this pattern you just need to repeat it throughout the entire song, even the solo part. There is no definitive chorus or hook so each section is listed as a verse. The intro just contains 4 bars of A.

Each bar consists of the same strumming pattern which is often referred to as either the 'Railroad

Tracks' rhythm or the 'Boom-Chicka' strum and is used a lot in country and blue grass music and is played at speed. Dynamics are involved to get the desired sound, where you soften the 1st and 3rd down strum by just hitting the top two strings of the ukulele as illustrated by the * as illustrated.


